

Ocelot

Ocelot is a Fox 44 carbon fiber racing sloop built by Schooner Creek Boat Works

Of the 8900 lbs. of displacement 4200 lbs is in the bulb. It has an overall length of 44' and a draft of 10', a carbon fiber Hall spar, double spreaders, rod rigging, PBO adjustable backstay, hydraulic mast jack and adjustable base plate. Quick release spinnaker pole and deck mounted struts. Harken deck gear and traveler with 8 winches, carbon boom with Forespar vang.

Rigging –

- Outhaul and Cunningham run below decks to cockpit
- Deck organizer and jammers for halyards and inhauler
- Main halyard exits mast below decks with jammer
- Main sheet runs below decks from traveler to secondary winches
- Main sheet traveler runs through cascade below decks to cockpit sole
- Sheets and guys run through deck mounted pulleys to primary winches
- Jib track adjusters run through below deck cascades to cockpit
- Adjustable backstay runs to third set of winches in cockpit
- Vang and tack lines run to cleats on cabin top

Sails-

- Doyle D4 Kevlar reinforced main sail
- Doyle D4 fractional jibs, #1, #2, #3, #4, #5
- Doyle spinnakers, 1 fractional, 2 masthead
- Doyle spinnaker staysail on continuous furler

Aux Power –

- 30 Hp Beta Marine saildrive engine with two blade folding prop
- 30 gallons of fuel - half in keel and half in day-tank
- Carbon engine beds and light weight surround

Navigation –

Tack Tick wireless instruments with masthead wind wand, speed and depth
Repeaters at mast and cabin house back and handheld remote
Raymarine GPS plotter at nav station
VHF at nav station - handheld VHF and GPS

Interior –

Single burner Butane stove
Foot pump water system, sea and fresh
Ice chest below nav station
Double V-berth forward, settee and quarter berths
Complete electrical system with house bank and separate starting battery
Hand pump head forward with storage tank
Manual bilge pump at cockpit

Trailer –

1994 Garge 3 axle gooseneck, fifth-wheel trailer with electric brakes
Mounts to keel bolt holes with custom tilting plate
Angled bunks hold hull at 45 degrees for 8'6'' width requirement
Keel lies flat with bulb over axles. Mast mounts to cradles on deck
No permits required to haul. 8 tall stands for dry-land storage included
